



There is a lot to be pissed off about when considering the state of contemporary universities. The high cost, the tepid classes, the bored students, the even more bored faculty, the grades, the shallow credentialism, the overwhelming corporatization - all of it so irritating/enraging that there is every reason to just say 'Fuck it. I'm not going into numbing debt for that BS.'

But there is something that's really great about university. Sitting around reading complicated and powerful texts with a bunch of good people who are really interested is awesome. Talking about ideas with people who are really jacked up to make an impact on the world is awesome. Encountering new and exciting ideas is awesome.

So the PTI is us trying to pull the best parts out of the university experience and ditch all the crap. We're hoping we've put together a challenging, exciting, inspiring three weeks that has some great classes, work experience placements, a bunch of really cool folks, some wicked evening events and lectures and readings - all of it for really cheap.

We're bringing together about 40 participants and 10 staff: anarchists, socialists, lefties, progressives, anti-colonialists, anti-authoritarians, ecologists of all stripes are welcome. The idea is to work, think and talk together - to articulate and comprehend differences sure - but to find common ground, get beyond factionlized pettiness and stimulate radical ecological and egalitarian social change.

It's open to all ages. It's not an alternative college, but an alternative to college. We'll be working clearly with college/university level material and a similar kind of intellectual engagement, but with a radical, engaged praxis. You'll be fine if you have never been to college, and fine if you have. It is for folks who want to revitalize and deepen their understanding of radical social change, meet other cool folks, build networks, get new ideas and also to communicate and build on our vision for the Thistle's core ideas and principles - horizontality, user-control, radical generosity, funk, collective action.

There may not be any spots left by the time you read this - we're almost full - but maybe. So if you're at all interested for this year or next, please do check us out:



Democracy in Action! Happy 40 years Windsor House!



Windsor House is a K to 12 parent participant democratic school that is publicly funded. It is located in North Vancouver and has been around for 40 years! Students at Windsor House are free to learn what they want and when they want! They have access to teachers, every sort of class imaginable, and many other resources! But, the real topper and I'd say the most impressive part of this school is the students' involvement in the running of the school! This mostly takes place each day at school meetings.

When projects are part of the state they often have to make concessions, and Windsor House is no exception. So over the years the school has had to battle an external system that isn't particularly friendly to how the school is run. Often these institutions impose many different ideas of what they deem as a better life for kids, more times than not this takes shape in systems of hierarchy being imposed. But despite these limitations to their ideal school, the folks at Windsor House, staff, parents and students alike, worked hard to sustain its core values of utmost respect for young people and a truly democratic school. It can be a big pain in the ass to have to fight for something you believe in but one thing is true: this sort of community engagement only helps to make you a stronger more politically engaged school, and nothing but good can come from that! And now Windsor House seems to have landed some good solid support and can move on to their next 40 years with more good work going towards the inside rather than fighting the beast outside!

One of the core principles of the thistle is deschooling: many thistlers in their younger days attended Windsor house and because of this, many of us attribute our deschooling time to these years and are forever grateful. As well, and equally notable, the founders of the thistle were former students and staff at the school prior to starting the thistle — this of course had an impact on how the thistle came to be, and the Thistle has always had a wonderful relationship with Windsor House! As Matt Hern says, "For forty years now Windsor House has been a fantastic project that has inspired the Purple Thistle in all kinds of ways. The original crew that founded the Thistle were all from WH and we have learned so much (and continue to learn) from them. I hope that the Thistle can emulate the kindness, generosity, tenaciousness and commitment that WH has always exemplified."

Thank you Windsor House and congratulations on your 40 years!
